ANZAC DAY 2009

All RAAF and WAAAF Veterans and serving members are invited to assemble at the usual 1030am in Elizabeth Street, City (just south of Market Street).

The ANZAC Day March format trialed last year has been abandoned and the 2009 march will revert to the format of previous years.

Accordingly, the RAAF will march as a complete service and current RAAF units are permitted to march with WW2 and Post WW2 units. Therefore, again this year, we will be accompanied by a contingent of serving members from Surveillance and Response Group (SRG), RAAF Williamtown. SRG includes Nos 41, 42 and 44 Wings which were also active in WWII as radar units. We are extremely grateful and delighted that serving RAAF members can once again join with us on this important day.

In addition to serving members, WWII and Post WWII veterans, one relative representing a deceased or disabled veteran may march with the Radar Branch. In particular, one descendant will be allowed to march as a 'carer' for Veterans with a genuine need. Representatives of Radar Branch veterans may wear the veteran's medals on his or her right side and are invited to march in the contingent rear rows Instructions for others who wish to participate in the march will be published by the RAAF NSW Association. Descendants who are not representing a veteran member of a Branch or association will be able to join the march in the RAAF Descendants section at the rear of the Air Force contingent.

The Radar Branch contingent will again be lead by Cec Blumenthal who served as a commissioned officer in radar stations throughout Australia and New Guinea.



PROFILE

Air Vice-Marshal Geoff Brown, AM

In this bulletin we profile the Deputy Chief of Air Force, Air Vice-Marshal Geoff Brown AM. He has made exemplary contributions to the RAAF as a fighter pilot, in responsibilities of command and in the introduction of the 'Wedgetail' Airborne Early Warning and Control aircraft into the Australian Defence Force.



The Deputy Chief of Air Force is responsible for the operation of the Headquarters of the Royal Australian Air Force located in Canberra

Air Vice-Marshal Geoff Brown joined the RAAF in February 1980 after completing an Engineering degree. He graduated from No 111 Pilot's Course in 1981and was initially posted to 12SQN Amberley to fly Chinooks. After three years at 12SQN he was posted to 2FTS Pearce and spent 18 months as a Flying Instructor before being posted to Central Flying School (CFS) East Sale in 1986. While at CFS he was a member of the Roulettes from 1987-89. He led the last Macchi team before they transitioned to the PC-9.

In 1990, Air Vice-Marshal Brown was posted to Williamtown for a Hornet conversion and then completed a short tour at 77SQN. On promotion to SQNLDR in 1991, he was posted to 75SQN Tindal as a Flight Commander.

In 1993 Air Vice-Marshal Brown was then posted to 77SQN as Executive Officer. He completed RAAF Staff College in 1995 and was subsequently posted to Headquarters Air Command as Staff Officer Operational Evaluation.

From 1997 to 2000, Air Vice-Marshal Brown commanded No 3 Squadron. He then completed F-111 conversion and assumed the position of Officer Commanding No 82 Wing in December 2000. In 2003 he commanded all F/A-18 and C-130 operations in Operation Iraqi Freedom and was awarded an Order of Australia and a Legion of Merit for his service in the operation. He was Officer Commanding Airborne Early Warning and Control Systems Program Office from June 2003 until December 2004 and spent 2005 at the Centre for Defence and Strategic Studies. He then commanded Air Combat Group from 2006 until taking up his current appointment as Director General Capability Planning in Air Force Headquarters. Air Vice-Marshal Brown was appointed as DCAF from 30 June 2008.

Air Vice-Marshal Brown has over 5000 hours in military aircraft.

He lives in Canberra with his wife Amanda and his two sons, Ryan and Jake. His sporting interests are gliding and golf.
